Free collection of waste electrical and electronic equipment

FROM BUSINESS CUSTOMERS

What types of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) are subject to regulations on collection and treatment?

Pursuant to the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Act, all appliances powered by electricity or batteries, as well as the batteries and accumulators themselves, must be labelled with the crossed-out wheelie bin symbol.

The crossed-out wheelie bin symbol placed on the product, its packaging or any accompanying documents means that the product must not be disposed of with other waste. It is the user's responsibility to deliver all used equipment, batteries and accumulators to the designated collection points for proper treatment. This marking also means that the equipment was placed on the market after 13 August 2005.

Empty printer ink and toner cartridges are also subject to the WEEE Act. Their users must therefore handle them carefully and dispose of them responsibly.

What to do when you want to dispose of large household appliances?

If you have a waste large household appliance (washing machine, refrigerator, freezer) and want to dispose of it in a manner that is environmentally friendly without buying any new, visit www.decydujesz.pl to fill in a form and arrange for the collection of your household appliance from anywhere in Poland.
